One of the dominant images in contemporary art since 1980 is the cross. This exhibition examines a variety of approaches, ranging from the representational to the abstract. Various questions are raised: how have these artists adapted an image once owned by the church to a contemporary context; to what extent has the cross become the property of popular culture and media; how is it used as an emblematic tool for presenting political commentary or effecting social change?
